

a Lieutenant Colonel. For the past 16 years he has worked as a Financial Advisor.



Seventh Rector of Blessed John XXIII Ordained As Bishop

On September 14, 2010, Bishop Peter J. Uglietto, previously rector of Blessed John XXIII Seminary, was ordained to the episcopate by Cardinal Seán P. O'Malley at the Cathedral of the Holy Cross in Boston, MA. Bishop Uglietto served as rector at Blessed John XXIII from 2005 to 2010.

Over 1,200 attendees, including nearly 300 priests and bishops from around the United States, attended the ceremony in which both Bishop Uglietto and Bishop Arthur Kennedy, the current rector of St. John's Seminary

in Brighton, MA, were ordained. After the ordination, a celebratory reception was held at Saint John's Seminary.


