Keith has a Masters in Finance from the University of Denver and worked for Fortune 500 companies before being accepted into the Seminary.

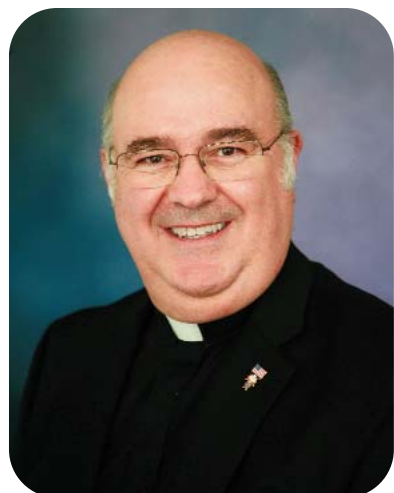

Sam has an MBA from Xavier University in Cincinnati, OH; and was an engineer at the Eli Lilly facility in Lafayette.

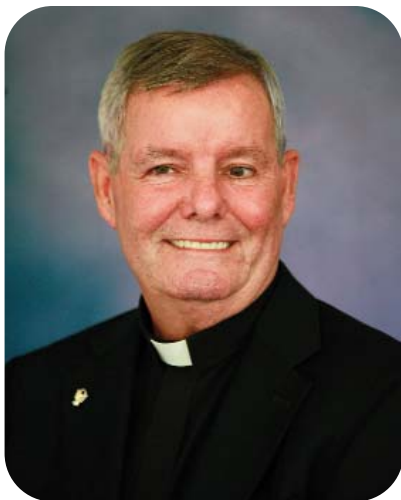

But when I arrived at the altar for the Benediction, a feeling of calm suddenly came over me as I raised the Monstrance for the blessing.”

James will be ordained on June 2nd at Saint Michael's Cathedral in Springfield, Massachusetts.

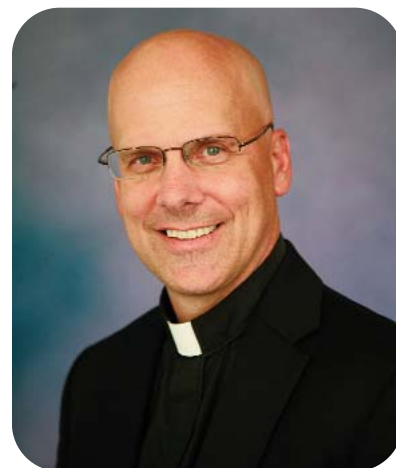
Diocese of Paterson, New Jersey

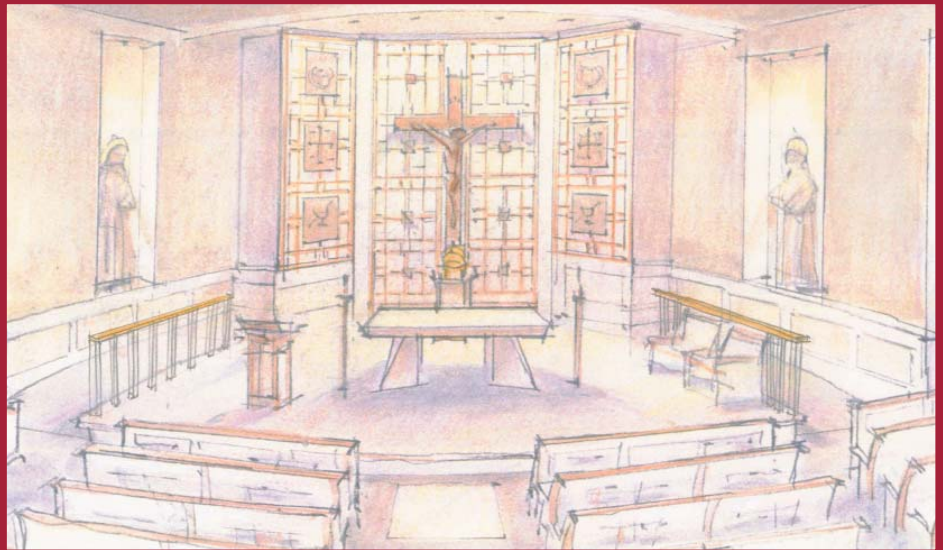

50th Anniversary - Chapel Renovation Update

As mentioned in previous Newsletters, one of the important initiatives of our 50th Anniversary celebration is the renovation of our Seminary chapel. This will incorporate many changes—and several additions.

Perhaps the most prominent of these will be the addition of statues of “Mary and Child” and “Saint Joseph” which will overlook the altar (see rendering).



The 60-inch statues of ‘Mary & Child’ and ‘Saint Joseph’ will be displayed in recessed alcoves on either side of the altar (see above). The statues are 3/4 relief carvings in chestnut wood, which is stained in shades of brown, and their garments are finished in burnished gold.



The statues are hand-carved by a notable church architecture company, Demetz Art Studio, located in Ortisei in northern Italy. Since 1872 their skilled artisans have produced ecclesiastical sculptures which are currently on display around the world.

Closer to home some of their more notable works are located in New York City. These include a life-sized Nativity

scene at Saint Patrick’s Cathedral in Manhattan and, most recently, a statue at the Saint Ephrem’s Parish ‘9/11 Memorial Garden of Hope’ in Brooklyn.

Our two chapel sculptures will complement the newly designed reredos and also enhance the prayerful, contemplative atmosphere of the entire chapel.

Reverence for the Holy Family and the celebration of their powerful examples of love, sacrifice and devotion are cornerstones of our Catholic Faith and central to the spiritual formation of those aspiring to the priesthood.

Many of our Seminary supporters have expressed interest in how they can be a part of the 50th Anniversary celebration. These sculptures offer donors a wonderful opportunity to recognize and remember a special loved one.
