


Silverio P. Di Fazio attended two years of Ministry Formation in Florida and previously spent 14 years assisting parish priests is his home diocese.

Saint Joseph Abbey, Spencer, MA


Brother Vincent Rogers, OCSO, taught parochial school prior to entering Saint Joseph's Abbey in Spencer, Massachusetts.


Thank you all for the contributions you made that have allowed me to say 'yes' to the vocation God gave me."

Rendell R. Torres was an Acoustics Professor at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute prior to his admission into priestly formation.



Rev. William B. Palardy Academic Dean and Registrar Celebrating 25 Years as a Priest

Rev. William B. Palardy is a graduate of Harvard University, with an A.B. in Classics. Upon graduation, Fr. Palardy entered St. John's Seminary in Boston, earning a M.A. and M.Div. He was ordained a priest in 1985. After ordination, his first appointment was Parochial Vicar at Holy Family Parish in Rockland, MA. In 1988, Fr. Palardy was invited by the Archdiocese of Boston to enter a doctoral program in Early Christian Studies at Catholic University in Washington, DC. He completed the program in 1992, earning a Ph.D. in Patristics.

Upon completion of his doctoral studies, Fr. Palardy accepted a position at St. John's Seminary where he taught Patristics, Ecclesiastical Latin and Homiletics, while also serving as Registrar and Dean of Students. During this time, Fr. Palardy contributed to the publishing of the sermons of Saint Peter Chrysologus by completing their English translation. In 2005, Fr. Palardy joined the Blessed John XXIII Seminary community in the position of Academic Dean.

"He has been an invaluable member of our faculty," says Rev. Peter J. Uglietto, Rector. A Mass and Dinner in honor of Fr. Palardy's 25th Anniversary of Ordination to Priesthood will be held this Spring at Blessed John XXIII National Seminary.

"I give thanks and praise to God for allowing me to share in the Priesthood of Jesus Christ these past 25 years, and in particular for the last 18 years spent in the wonderful work of helping prepare future priests. It will be an honor to celebrate this milestone with the members of the Seminary community, along with my family and friends."
