Rector Transition at Blessed John XXIII

For the last five years, Rev. Peter J. Uglietto has served as the Seventh Rector of Blessed John XXIII National Seminary

The Seminary community is proud to announce that, on June 30, 2010, His Holiness Benedict XVI named Father Uglietto to the Episcopacy as Auxiliary Bishop of the Archdiocese of Boston.

"It has been a great privilege to serve in the ministry of priestly formation as Rector of Blessed John XXIII National Seminary. I will miss this very challenging but gratifying work," said Bishop-Elect Uglietto during a press conference announcing his new role.

Bishop-Elect Uglietto will be ordained the 35th auxiliary bishop of the archdiocese on September 14, 2010, at the Cathedral of the Holy Cross. Following the ordination, he will become Bishop of the North Region of the archdiocese which includes 63 parishes and 22 schools.

Rev. William B. Palardy has been named the Eighth Rector of Blessed John XXIII. In 2005, Fr. Palardy joined the Seminary community as Academic Dean. He will assume his new responsibilities as Rector on September 2, 2010.

New Seminary Fund-raising Initiatives

The upcoming academic year brings many changes at our Seminary. As Rev. William B. Palardy assumes the position of Rector, we are also expecting a very large incoming class. Increased enrollment will require improvements and expansions to our facility, as well as funding for current and new programs.

These increased needs present challenges to the staff of our Development Department, who are charged with fundraising. Donations currently contribute 50 percent of the cost of educating our seminarians, and the department's crucial mission is to keep tuition affordable.

As our community faces new challenges, we are pleased to welcome Dick Murphy as Development Director at Blessed John XXIII. Dick comes to us with an extensive background in successful fundraising. With his guidance, we have begun several new initiatives.

"Under Kate Folan's leadership as Associate Director of Institutional Advancement, our Lawn Party and Golf Tournament events continue to achieve record attendance and revenue. We plan to further diversify our sources of income to meet the greater financial needs of the Seminary," says Dick Murphy.

"For example, we are expanding donor outreach via a series of visits and local receptions. We are pleased that Vivienne Blake has accepted the position of Grant Writer and is actively pursuing revenue opportunities in that area. We have added an online giving component to our web

site (www.blessedjohnxxiii.edu/support_us) and increased the visibility of our Seminary as a national institution through attendance at vocation seminars and advertising in Catholic media. In the weeks ahead, we will offer our supporters yet another philanthropic option—bequests," says Murphy.

Research indicates that the motivation behind a will or bequest with a charitable component includes: "giving back, wanting to make a difference and a duty to support the organization." Yet less than 10 percent of Americans have named a charity in

their wills. Research suggests that either donors are unaware of this option, or they are not being asked to consider a bequest in their estate planning. "This is another fundraising opportunity we're pursuing," says Murphy.

The Blessed John XXIII community is also approaching a significant milestone—our 50th anniversary of preparing dedicated, talented second-career men for priesthood. With the support of our many generous donors, we look forward to continuing this unique and vital mission far into the future.

On May 8, 2010, Rev. John C. McVoy, III, was one of two men ordained as priests for the Diocese of Wilmington, DE.

His ordination represents an important milestone, as he is the first African-American priest for this diocese.

His children and mother, along with family and friends were among the large crowd at the Cathedral of Saint Peter in Wilmington. Several members of the Blessed John XXIII Seminary community were also in attendance.

During the ordination

Malooly and prostrated
himself before the altar.
He knelt for the laying on
of hands by the Bishop
and each of the almost 50
concelebrating priests in
attendance.

Fr. McVoy was then robed in the vestments of priesthood and took his place at the side of Bishop Malooly for the consecration.


