May God bless you all!



Dr. John J. Clabeaux, Ph.D. has accepted a position as Professor of Sacred Scripture.


He received an A.M. and a Ph.D. from Harvard University. This accomplished scholar currently teaches at the Pontifical College Josephinum

School of Theology in Columbus, OH. He previously taught at the Harvard Divinity School and at St. John's Seminary in Boston.

He was named a "Consultor" to the Executive Committee of the Catholic Biblical Association of America from 2009 - 2011 and serves on its Program Committee.

Dr. Clabeaux has hosted three 13-week lecture series on Catholic TV, a national cable network. These include the recent award-winning program, "The Gospel of Matthew."

narians' family members and well-wishers who had come to share in this important milestone in their priestly formation journey.

29th Annual Lawn Party Raises \$250,000 - a New Record!

On Wednesday, September 22, the 29th Annual Lawn Party was a special homecoming for former Rector, Bishop Peter J. Uglietto, now an Auxiliary Bishop for the Archdiocese of Boston who represented Cardinal Seán O'Malley during the event.

He was welcomed by a record number of benefactors, friends, bishops, alumni, and seminarians at this premier fundraiser, held just a week after his Episcopal Ordination. In honor of Bishop Peter, the Lawn Party Committee created a new \$15,000 giving level – the Bishop Peter J. Uglietto Society.

"We are honored to support priestly vocations while recognizing the twenty years of dedicated service Bishop Peter gave to Blessed John XXIII," said Gretchen and John LaRossa, MD, who served as Event Chairs and donors to the newly created society.

"At this year's event we honored the new bishop, thanked him personally for his dedication to priestly vocations, congratulated Fr. Bill Palardy on his appointment as eighth Rector, and met those preparing to serve us as parish

Blessed John XXIII Community Participates in March for Life Events





During the summer academic break, Rev. Thomas F.
Schmitt, who is the Dean of Seminarians at Blessed John XXIII and also an alumnus (Class of 1991) went on pilgrimage to Italy with parishioners from his home diocese – the Diocese of Springfield, MA. During the trip, he was able to connect with a recently ordained member of the Class of 2010, Rev. Silverio (Sal) P. DiFazio, from the Archdiocese of Saint Augustine, FL.

"At the culmination of my pilgrimage, I was proud to have the opportunity to concelebrate Mass with Fr. Sal at the Altar of our Seminary's patron," said Fr. Schmitt. The Mass was held at the altar of Blessed John XXIII in Vatican City. This altar is located a short distance from the main or papal altar in Saint Peter's Basilica.

"Fr. Sal was born in Ponza, Italy, and he has a great affection for Pope John XXIII, who was the pontiff of his youth," said Fr. Schmitt. "During his homily, Fr. Sal spoke of his deep gratitude for his calling to priesthood and the unexpected blessing of being able to celebrate as a newly-ordained priest at the tomb of 'Papa Buono' or Good Pope John, as he was known throughout Italy."
