During this busy academic year our Blessed John XXIII community members have participated in events both within our Seminary and

in the larger Catholic community.

Our newly-renovated chapel was rededicated during our annual Alumni Days event. We were especially pleased that the previous rector, Bishop Peter J. Uglietto of the Archdiocese of Boston, was able to preside at this important milestone in our

Seminary history. Additionally, our seminarians appeared on the CatholicTV national cable network. The diaconate ordination of seminarian John Hurley - which was filmed in our chapel - was featured on their show, 'Real to Reel,' and some members of our Schola also performed in their Annual Telethon.

As is our custom, a large group of seminarians, faculty members and alumni from Blessed John XXIII journeyed to Washington, DC to participate in the annual March for Life. In addition, three members of our community were honored with

Cheverus Award medals for their service to the Church. We also celebrated the Ministries of Reader and Acolyte. Details about all these, and more, are included in this Newsletter.

Alumni Days was held from October 16-17, 2012. Nearly 50 alumni attended this event and were impressed with the facility upgrades to their alma mater.

"It was wonderful to see their enthusiasm about the renovations - especially the Chapel - which we consider the 'heart' of our Seminary," said Rev. William B. Palardy, Rector. On October 17th, our newly-renovated chapel was rededicated during Mass as the 'Alumni' Chapel.

The alumni also enjoyed a keynote address on Religion and Politics by Rev. Bryan Hehir. This distinguished scholar has served on the faculty of Georgetown University and Harvard University Divinity School. He currently is a faculty member at the John F. Kennedy School of Government at Harvard, where he teaches courses in the practice of religion and public life.

The Seminary administration also solicited feedback from the attendees. "There is no better way to evaluate

Schmitt. "We also received some excellent suggestions to potentially improve our program," he added.

Three members of our Seminary community were among those presented with Cheverus Award medals in recognition of their long-term service to the Catholic Church. They are **Sister Mary Jude Waters**, **O.P.**, Executive Assistant to our Rector; **Mr. John A. McNeice**, **Jr.**, a long-time supporter and member of our Board of Trustees; and **Mrs. Ann Garvey**, a member of our Lawn Party committee. We congratulate them on receiving this honor.

Cardinal Seán P. O'Malley, Archbishop of Boston, presented the medals on November 18, 2012, during a Vespers service at the Cathedral of the Holy Cross. These sterling silver medals bear the likeness of Bishop Jean-Louis Lefebvre de Cheverus - Boston's first bishop.



Seminary Community Participates in March for Life Events

The Opening Mass for the National Prayer Vigil for Life was held at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception on the evening before the March - Thursday, January 25, 2013. With nearly 1,000 priests and seminarians participating, the procession for this Vigil lasted almost an hour.

Afterwards, several seminarians remained for the National Rosary for Life at 10pm, followed by Night Prayer and an all-night vigil. During the vigil, the Benediction and Novena to Our Lady of Perpetual Help were led by Blessed John XXIII seminarians - among them members of the deacon class - Deacon Ivan Olmo, '13, (Diocese of Orlando); Deacon Patrick Cunningham, '13, (Diocese of Bismark); and Deacon Ronald Cattany, '13, (Archdiocese of Denver).

The next morning, on Friday, January 26th, many of our seminarians attended the Youth Mass at the Verizon Center before meeting up with several more Seminary alumni from the Washington area. The entire group then attended the Rally on the Mall and March for Life, which culminated in front of the United States Supreme Court.

"This was my first time attending the March for Life," said Anthony Bittar, a First Theology seminarian from the Archdiocese of Denver. "It was a great opportunity for people of different backgrounds to come together for one cause - the sacredness of life."

Ministry of Reader Conferred on Thirteen Candidates

On October 31, 2012, His Excellency Gregory John Hartmayer, O.F.M. Conv., Bishop of the Diocese of Savannah, celebrated Mass and conferred the Ministry of Reader at Blessed John XXIII. During this Mass, 13 seminarians from 12 dioceses were installed into this ministry.

"This marks an important milestone in the progression of our seminarians as they prepare for priestly ordination," said Rev. William B. Palardy, Rector of Blessed John XXIII. "We were pleased that Bishop Hartmayer was able to officiate."

Seminarians receive conferral of ministries during each year of their formation: Acolyte in first theology, Reader in second and Candidacy in third theology - in preparation for their ordination to the Diaconate and Priesthood, which typically takes place in their home dioceses or religious communities.

"This was a grace-filled moment on my journey to ordination," said Gregory Bierbaum, a seminarian in second theology from the Diocese of Colorado Springs.

devote his life to taking care of others. He is currently assigned to the Bureau for Exceptional Children and Adults (Jericho) in Holyoke, Massachusetts.

On December 7, 2012, twelve seminarians in their first year of theological studies received the ministry of Acolyte. The Principal Celebrant was His Excellency, The Most Reverend Richard J. Malone, Th.D., Bishop of the Diocese of Buffalo and Apostolic Administrator of the Diocese of Portland.

The Chapel was filled to capacity with family members and well-wishers who shared this important milestone in the priestly formation of these seminarians. After Mass, Bishop Malone joined the new Acolytes for a festive meal with the guests, seminarians, faculty and staff.

The duties of this important ministry are outlined in an Apostolic Letter from Pope Paul VI - "Acolytes are responsible for aiding deacons and priests. It is their duty to attend to the service of the altar and to assist in liturgical celebrations, especially the celebration of Mass.

The acolyte should learn all matters concerning public divine worship and strive to grasp their inner spiritual meanings: in that way he will be able each day to offer himself entirely to God, be an example to all by his gravity and reverence in church, and have a sincere love for the Mystical Body of Christ, the people of God, especially for the weak and the sick."
