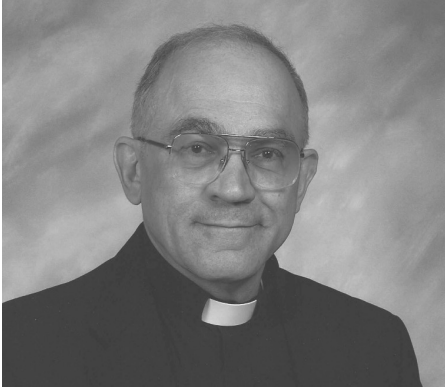


# Blessed John XXIII National Seminary

We are pleased to announce that Father Leo M. Manglaviti, S.J., S.T.L., Ph.D., class of 1996, will rejoin the full-time faculty here at Blessed John XXIII as Director of the new optional Pre-Theology Program.

This one-year program, which has a full class for the inaugural year, offers courses in philosophy and basic Catholic doctrine for candidates whose Bishops or religious superiors deem it appropriate.

Upon the announcement of this new addition to the Seminary curriculum, Boston businessman and Seminary trustee, John A. McNeice and his wife, Margarete offered to fully endow the new - **Margarete and John McNeice Faculty Chair in Pre-Theology.**

Citing the \$1 Million Endowment, Father Peter J. Uglietto, Rector, praised McNeice's leadership and generosity.

"Having the backing of exemplary leaders, such as John McNeice is a great blessing," said Fr. Uglietto. "Long before we even began the admissions process, John stepped up to the plate," he continued. "We appreciate this vote of confidence as we continue to offer excellence in seminary formation here at Blessed John XXIII."

## Seminarian Studies Spanish Language and Culture During Summer Break

Paul V. Sullivan, class of 2008, spent June 9th - July 21st at the International Institute for Culture in Pueblo, Mexico attending the seminar - "Preparing for Ministry to Spanish-Speakers." This institute specializes in Spanish instruction for priests, seminarians and members of religious communities.

Paul learned about the Spanish language and culture while attending classes with twenty other seminarians and priests from across the United States. The students received four hours of daily language instruction, along with twice-weekly lectures on the history of the Catholic Church in Mexico. They also had opportunities visit local attractions, including the Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe.

He was inspired to attend the seminar by Cardinal Seán Patrick O'Malley, OFM, Cap., who Paul says has repeatedly encouraged priests to learn a second language to better serve parishioners.

Individuals wishing to leave a legacy should determine a dollar amount or a percentage of their estate they would like to contribute.

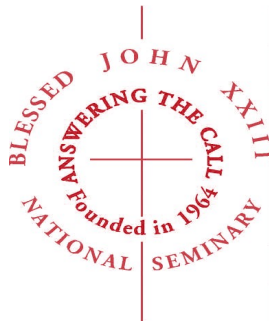
Other options include donating property; such as land, an automobile, stocks, bonds and mutual funds, retirement funds assets, or leaving a legacy through a life insurance policy.
